Useful Revision Strategies:

Quizlet- we will continue to use quizlet to set vocab learning homework for students. Students can also access a range of bespoke quizlet sets containing key grammar, structures and juicy bits, as well as topic specific vocab and phrases.

They can search online in Quizlet → Rainfordmfl → study sets

CPG Revision guides and workbooks – Students were given the opportunity to purchase these books. The revision workbook comes with downloadable listening tracks and all of the answers and transcripts are at the back for students to use.

Individual mock mock speaking appointments – Teachers have made individual appointments with all staff to complete a full mock speaking exam before their final end of year 10 mock. This will enable us to give detailed feedback and is an opportunity for students to experience the full exam.

How do I revise useful phrases or chunks of text?

- Use a whiteboard to write out the sentence. Your child should read the sentence a few times, then you should cover some words in the text and see if they can still read it correctly.
- Write the first letter of the each word and see if you can fill in the sentence.
- Use memorizer.me to practise this online.

Flashcards

- Look at the words you need to memorise. Filter out the words that are easy to remember and create a new list of the words you think you will struggle to remember.
- Make flashcards for the words you think you'll struggle remembering. Write the word in Spanish on one side and the word in English on the other side.
- Look at your flashcards a few times. Then, look at the Spanish/French word and try to remember what the English was.
- Shuffle the cards and do it again a couple of times.
- Now, try to look at the English words and say or write the words in Spanish/French.
- Shuffle the cards and do it again a couple of times.
- Put the cards that you know very well aside.
- Concentrate on the cards that you find harder. Write the words out several times/ listen to the pronunciation in Google translate or Quizlet and then give them another go!
