Gamelan Music of Indonesia



A **gamelan** is a **traditional music group** from **Indonesia**. Indonesia is the name given to a group of islands in the **Indian ocean**.

In Indonesia, gamelan music is considered **sacred** and believed to have supernatural power. People believe that the **instruments are guided by spirits**.

Musicians take off their shoes when they play in a gamelan and do not step over their instruments in case it offends the spirits.

The **instruments** in a gamelan are **mainly percussion** and include **gongs**, **metallophones**, **xylophones**, **drums**, **cymbals**, **and flutes**. The instruments are mainly made from **bronze**.

The instruments in a gamelan are tuned to a **5 note scale** called a **slendro**.

Gamelan music is always performed in groups, so there is no place for an individual to show off.

Gamelan is **only played at certain occasions** including **ritual ceremonies** and for the **royal family.**

The word 'gamelan' comes from the Javanese word 'gamel' which means to strike or hammer.
