TASK 2: Geography in the News

Geography is a subject that is all around us - It is important that you keep up with current affairs as Geography is a subject that is always changing. Over the summer, keep up with the news and look for Geography related events. This could be a hurricane in America, an earthquake or wildfire or an oil spill. Pick one Geography related event and become a roving reporter. Write a news story and include the following details:



- 1) *Pick a name for your newspaper*
- 2) *Think of a title for your story*
- 3) *Include a picture to illustrate your event*
- 4) *Tell me where in the world your event has happened (include a map if you like)*
- 5) *Explain what happened*
- 6) *Identify how your chosen event has affected people and/or the environment.*

This might include:

- *social effects (such as number of people affected or made homeless)*
- *economic effects (costs in £ or \$, effect on industry and agriculture etc)*
- *environmental effects (effects on plants and animals)*

In Geography, we will always use these 3 different types of effects to investigate an issue or case study
