

Covid 19 Catch Up Premium Funding

Rainford High will receive £118000 to support students in catching up and recovering due to absence during the pandemic. Schools should use this funding for specific activities to support pupils to catch up for lost teaching time over the previous months.

The impact on the students will be measured by students in Y11 and Y13 making comparable progress for students in the school pre the Covid19 Pandemic at both GCSE and Post 16.

Students within the school will also have made comparable progress for their stage of education by the end of the academic year 2020/21 based in the school's internal data.

The school will also consider issues on mental health, specific covid related incidents and school attendance of both staff and students in analysing the effectiveness on the use of catch up funding.
