Each year two young representatives from each district are selected by lottery to participate in The Hunger Games.</p> <p><u>Lord of the Rings</u></p> <p>Set in Middle-Earth, the world at some distant time in the past, a fellowship consisting of humans, an elf, a dwarf, a wizard and hobbits embarks on a quest to the dark land of Mordor. Their quest is to return a magical ring to the fires of Mount Doom and put an end to the power of the Dark Lord Sauron</p> <p><u>Harry Potter – Deathly Hallows</u></p> <p>The novel follows Harry Potter, an eleven-year old orphan, who discovers he is the son of powerful wizards and has unique magical powers of his own. He leaves his dreary life to study at Hogwarts where he meets new friends and battles dangerous enemies.</p>		
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
