Outstanding Progress Targets



- We will set an Outstanding Progress Target for the end of KS4 in each subject
- This target will be challenging, aspirational and realistic
- It will mean, if achieved, that no more than 14% of students nationally, with the same starting point, will get a higher grade than your child
- This will be based on KS2 results
- We will review progress against these targets each term, and send the results home

Outstanding Progress Targets



Anne's grades from primary school were just above national

average

A grade 5 (old 'B') in History might be a good result. 26% achieved a higher grade:

- 14% = 6
- \cdot 8% = 7
- · 3% = 8
- 1% = 9

Why do some students make better progress than others? What's in their control?


- 1. Attendance turn up all day every day


