Pathway A - Why do I have to pick one of those subjects?



- Science, Computer Science, French, Spanish, History and Geography are known as 'EBacc' subjects
- This stands for 'English Baccalaureate'. These subjects are considered to be challenging and are highly valued by future employers, colleges or universities
- We want to make sure every student leaves school with the best academic profile possible, supporting our decision to emphasise this in the KS4 Curriculum process.

Further Benefits of the 'EBacc'



- A student can say they have achieved the 'EBacc' if they have gained good grades in English, Maths, Science or Computer Science, one Language and one Humanity (History or Geography)
- For those who have ambitions to go on to university after college/sixth form it is a good idea to try to achieve this measure
- Some courses are very competitive, and some universities may consider GCSEs as well as A-Levels to help them differentiate between excellent candidates
- Having the full English Baccalaureate could help a your chances in accessing the course of your choice at college/university

A Little About Vocational Subjects



- Subjects which have an emphasis on practical skills
- Directly relevant to the real world outside of school
- Often link to particular career routes
- Flexibility in the timing and style of assessment – fewer end of year exams than GCSEs
- A significant coursework element remains in these qualifications, unlike most GCSE courses
- Beneficial if you are able to manage your time well throughout the year and can work to deadlines
- Nationally recognised qualifications at an equivalent level to GCSEs.
- Graded differently (Distinction*, Distinction, Merit, Pass)

Great reasons for choosing a subject



- Career idea, subject links well
- Based on knowledge from the KS4 Curriculum Booklet or the videos seen on the website
- Love of subject
- Assessment method suits me
- Researched topics of study
- Subject matches my hobbies
- Subject matches my skills and strengths
- Discussed with parents/carers and sought good advice

Poor reasons for choosing a subject



- My friend is taking...
- Liking a particular teacher
- That course looks easy...
- Don't like anything else
- Brother/sister took this subject...
- Someone else said I should do it –
without proper consideration

These choices are likely to have some influence on the next phase of your life – and very likely even longer!
